

## WHO CAN JOIN?

- Students in the collegiate level of CUAC member institutions in Asia and other parts of the world.
- College students of higher education institutions that have active partnership with TUA.
- College students from the Philippines who wish to join the program, with consent from their home institutions, in pro-rata participation fees.

## APPLICATION PROCESS

Interested students shall fill out the online application form not later than December 16, 2022. They shall prepare a soft copy of the following documents:

- Internationally recognized COVID-19 Vaccination Card, with complete vaccination status and with the latest booster shot on earlier than September 2022.
- For foreign participants, a medical insurance or health card that is recognized and accepted in hospitals in the Philippines.
- Filled out permission and waiver form, signed by the student's parent or guardian.
- For non-CUAC member institutions, a letter of authorization signed by the director of the office in charge of service-learning, linkages, or study abroad programs.

## PARTICIPATION FEE

The S-L fee is **US\$850** which covers boarding, meals, community work expenses, local transportation, seminar kit, city tour, and program shirt.

Payment can be done through the S-L coordinators of CUAC member schools. For non-CUAC institutions, they may contact the organizing committee for instructions and issuance of invoice.

## SPECIAL LECTURES

Selected speakers will deliver lectures in relation to the experiences of participants in partner communities and the Five Marks of Mission of the Anglican Church.



## GROUP DYNAMICS

A friendly competition among participants to foster bonding and socialization.



## CITY TOUR

A whole day tour of historical and interesting places withing the Metropolitan Manila area, and the chance to shop and dine out as a big group.

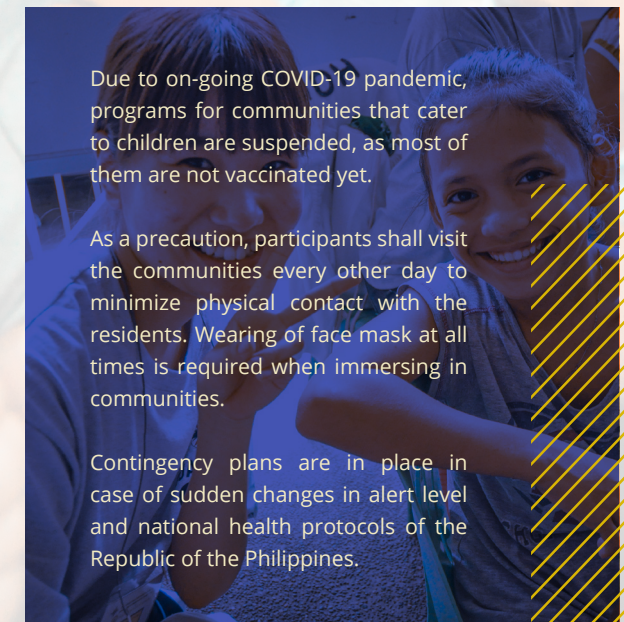

Due to on-going COVID-19 pandemic, programs for communities that cater to children are suspended, as most of them are not vaccinated yet.

As a precaution, participants shall visit the communities every other day to minimize physical contact with the residents. Wearing of face mask at all times is required when immersing in communities.
